## Fast and Female descended on Surrey!

[Fast and Female](#) is a Canadian organization that focusses on getting and keeping girls in sport. According to studies, girls drop out of sports at 6X the rate of boys in their early teens. To keep this from happening Fast and Female has created events to help girls feel more empowered and have a greater sense of belonging.

On November 17th, the organization hosted an event at Guildford Park School in Surrey. More than 200 girls, aged 9 to 12, participated in the event which included confidence building, mental confidence sessions and physical activity stations. The four sport stations featured Ringette, Freestyle Skiing, Wheelchair Basketball and Archery.

The combined efforts of Semiahmoo Archers' female competitors and instructors, and the use of BC Archery equipment, these girls were able to try their hand at archery. Judging by the cheers, I think we were their favourite station!

Thank you to Fast and Female for bringing your event to BC, and thank you to the women of Semiahmoo Archery for showing the girls what a great community Archery can be for them.
