



Rules of Shooting

Approved by the Board 30th of July, 2015

Rule 6 repealed March 7, 2018, effective April 2, 2018

1. All Archery Canada rules, as amended from time to time, apply to the extent reasonable for the provincial context, and as amended below.
 - 1.1. A reference to
 - a. AC is a reference to BCAA
 - b. Canada or Canadian is a reference to British Columbia or British Columbian
 - c. National is a reference to provincial unless the reference does not reasonably apply to the provincial context.

Variations to all chapters

Subject to paragraph 1.1., there are no variations to any AC Chapters except as noted below.

Variations to AC Chapter 3

- 3.1 BCAA Annual Championships
 - a. BCAA Indoor Championships: two AC/WA 18m-Rounds (AC 4.5.2, 7.2.2.3, Book 3 App AC 2), one round shot each day over two days
 - b. BCAA Outdoor Championships: one Canadian 1200 Round (AC 4.5.1.15) shot in one day, and on the following day either:
 - i. one 24-target Field Round (AC 4.5.3.1), or
 - ii. one 720 Round (AC 4.5.1.5 to 4.5.1.7)
 - c. BCAA 3-D Championships: Canadian National 3-D Outdoor Championships format (AC 3.18.7.4) excluding the Grand Prix Shoot-off.
 - d. JOP Indoor Championships: two Canadian 300-rounds (AC 4.5.2.9) shot in one day.
 - e. JOP Outdoor Championships: one Canadian 900 Round (AC 4.5.1.14) shot in one day, and modified for JOP classes and distances, as laid out in the JOP Manual
- 3.2 Categories
 - a. BCAA Championships use the AC Age and Gender Classes (AC 4.2) and Equipment Divisions (AC 4.3), as amended by section 4 below, except the organizers of a BCAA Championship event may add one Equipment Division, with or without Age and Gender Class limitations.
 - b. JOP Championships use the JOP Age and Gender Classes and Equipment Divisions pursuant to the BCAA JOP Manual.
- 3.3 Judges' Attire
 - a. During a Championship event, judges
 - i. will wear a red golf shirt (long or short sleeves) and black, white or grey pants, shorts or skirt,
 - ii. may wear a red vest or jacket, and
 - iii. may wear a hat.

Variations to AC Chapter 4

4.1 Addendum to AC 4.2 (Age Classes)

- a. To compete in a Masters 60 class, a person must be 60 or older on December 31 of the current year.
- b. To compete in a Masters 70 class, a person must be 70 or older on December 31 of the current year.

4.2 Addendum to AC 4.3.2

- a. For all Masters and Senior Classes, Longbow is also included.

5. Variance to AC 6.1.1. Medals will be awarded to only the first place in each Guest category.
