TOP / CWG Camp held at Starr Archery

BC Archery hosted a Target Objective Performance (TOP) Camp in Mission BC on March 9-11. In attendance were a total of 11 coaches and 17 athletes ranging from Cub to Junior age.

Our National Team recurve coach, Shawn Riggs, and Canada's three-time Olympian athlete, Crispin Duenas, along with local coaches Susan Lemke, Paul van Tassel and Linda Price, spent technical time with each athlete and their coach.

The athletes participated in individual and mixed team match play to simulate the Canada Winter Games (CWG) event along with discussions on the importance of mental training and psychological well being.



Athletes participated in proper warm up sessions and learned about the need to incorporate a physical component into a training plan. Crispin also introduced athletes to the Artemis Archery App used by the National Team.

Shawn Riggs presented the Gold Medal Profile (GMP) and Podium Results Tracking (PRT) work done by Archery Canada to move our Canadian athletes closer to the Podium.

We hope both the athletes and the coaches were inspired and motivated to take their archery to the next level!

Athlete Funding—payouts and changes

Athlete Funding payouts have been calculated; a total of \$29,725 has been distributed through High-Performance Funding applications.

[New eligibility requirements](#) come into effect for the next round of funding applications (for the 2018 competition year, to be submitted by Jan31-2019). Target benchmarks and mandatory events have been posted. 3D criteria will be posted soon.

Coaching Clinic—Instructor of Beginner Archers

An Instructor of Beginner Archers coaching clinic is scheduled for June 2 & 3 in North Vancouver. If you would like to participate, please follow the instructions posted on [the website](#). This is the first level of coaching certification and is a great start to helping athletes at your club or just improving your own understanding of the sport.

Are there any "Level" certified coaches out there looking to transfer their certification to the new NCCP certifications? You may be able to sit in on this clinic for free.
