New Year, new rules. The legality of equipment being used at a tournament is always the responsibility of the archer. Make sure you check the most current rulebook ([Archery Canada](#), [World Archery](#), [NFAA](#), [IFAA](#), [ASA](#), etc) and interpretations to ensure that your gear complies with the rules for the tournament. Some events have their own rules as well, so be sure to check for more information when you register. One of the latest [World Archery interpretations](#) is about what does and does not qualify as an equipment failure. Be prepared—know the rules.

Have you renewed your membership yet?

Memberships expire December 31st. Don't miss out on shooting a registered tournament or other benefits, renew now! Some clubs require you to be a valid BC Archery member in order to participate. Starting next month only 2020 members will have the newsletter emailed to them.

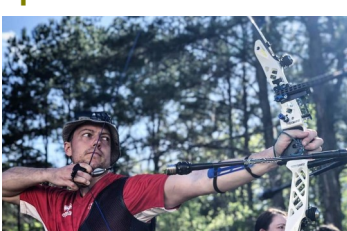
BC Indoor Championships—Easter weekend

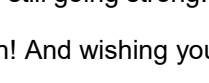
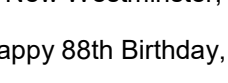
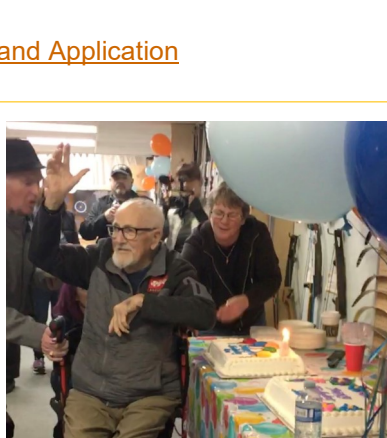
Happy Birthday Ron Boorman
