All Archery Canada rules, as amended from time to time, apply to the extent reasonable for the provincial context, and as amended below.

A reference to

- AC is a reference to BC Archery
- Canada or Canadian is a reference to British Columbia or British Columbian
- National is a reference to provincial unless the reference does not reasonably apply to the provincial context.

### **Variations to AC Rules for BC Archery Annual Championships**

Events/Rounds:

- BC Archery Indoor Championships: two AC/WA 18m-Rounds (AC 4.5.2, 7.2.2.3, Book 3 App AC 1), one round shot each day over two days
- BC Archery Outdoor Championships will be a 2 day event of which the rounds will be determined between the Board and the Host Club. The Championship will consist of two of the following rounds:
  - 720 Round (AC 4.5.1.5 to 4.5.1.7)
  - Canadian 1200 Round (AC 4.5.1.15)
  - 24-target Field Round (WA 8.1.1.10)
- BC Archery 3D Championships will be a 2 day event consisting of 40 targets per day.
- JOP Indoor Championships: two Canadian 300-rounds (AC 4.5.2.9) shot in one day and modified for JOP classes as laid out in the JOP Manual
- JOP Outdoor Championships: one “JOP720” shot in one day, and modified for JOP classes and distances, as laid out in the JOP Manual
  - ❖ JOP Championships only: In the event of an equipment failure or a medical issue, a (15) fifteen-minute allowance may be made to provide time for repairs or medical attention. The athlete shall make up the appropriate number of arrows at the earliest opportunity under the supervision of a Judge. JOP events should be used as a teaching/learning opportunity.

Categories:

- BC Archery Championships use the AC Age and Gender Classes (AC 4.2) and Equipment Divisions (AC 4.3), with the following amendments:
  - a. To compete in a Masters 60 class, a person must be 60 or older on December 31 of the current year.
  - b. To compete in a Masters 70 class, a person must be 70 or older on December 31 of the current year.
  - c. JOP Championships use the JOP Age and Gender Classes and Equipment Divisions pursuant to the BC Archery JOP Manual.
  - d. Hunter Class (AC 22.11) will not be offered at the BC Indoor or Outdoor Target Championships.
  - e. Instinctive and Longbow will not be offered at the BC Outdoor Target Championships
  - f. The host organizers may add one Equipment Division, with Age and Gender Class limitations.

#### Medals: (Variance to AC 6.1.1.)

- Guest Medals will be awarded to only the first place in each Guest category.
  - a. Two Age Classes for Guest categories will be offered:
    - Adult: 18 years of age and older,
    - Youth: 17 years and younger.
  - b. Three equipment divisions for Guest categories will be offered at the BC Indoor and Outdoor Championships:
    - Recurve (WA 11.)
    - Compound (AC 11.2)
    - Barebow (AC 11.5)
- Non-competitive athletes (3D only) are not awarded any acknowledgment based on score (medals, ribbons, etc) from neither BC Archery nor the Host organization.

#### Judges' Attire

- During a Championship event, judges
  - will wear a red golf shirt (long or short sleeves) and black pants, shorts or skirt,
  - may wear a red vest or jacket, and
  - may wear a hat.
